Gun-shot wound of right fore-arm and right hip.He receives a pension of seventeen dollars per month.

Here give the claimant's statement (as briefly and as compactly as possible) in regard to the date of origin and cause of his disabilities and in the manner in which they affect him.

He makes the following statement in regard to the origin of his disabilities and date when first discovered by him: Shot in arm at Antietam Md. Sept. 17, 1862 was in West Philadelphia Hospital until Dec. 13th, 1862.
Shot in hip at Spotsylvania, Court House May 12, 1864 was in Columbia College Hospital until Nov. 17, 1864.

Birthplace, Belmont County, Ohio; age, 70 years; height, 5ft. 10in weight, 160 pounds; complexion, dark; color of eyes, gray; color of hair, gray; occupation, Farmer; permanent marks and scars other than those described below, Tattoo J.C.Way, 1862 and Flag on left fore-arm.

We hereby certify that upon examination we find the following objective conditions:

Pulse rate, 124 132 140; respiration, 22 28 36; temperature, 98°;

Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of instructions, and make a separate paragraph for each disability.

Gun-shot wound of right Fore-arm:

Scar of entrance eight inches below acromium process in front of right arm and four and one half inches above elbow joint, scar is one and one half inches by one inch and is adherent and dragging and the biceps muscle is atrophied. Measurements of right arm at acromium process is eleven and one fourths, at middle third ten and three fourths and lower third nine and one half inches; of left arm in respective positions eleven ten and one half and nine inches. Motion is not painful beyond accustomed positions however when claimant raises his hand and arm to head pain is experienced.

Gun-shot wound of right hip:

Entrance scar is four and one half inches from spinal column and is eleven by one inch is adherent and dragging, exit scar is directly in front of entrance and is inflamed with pus poumation coming out of a small opening which from its character is indigative of being from the bone, as there has been several large pieces of bone sluf out, taking the entire spine of the ileum. Claimant can not stoop over or walk up a hill or stairs without assistance and he walks with a limp also has to use a cane. Claimant asserts that the wound runs more during the summer months than the winter.

Heart:

There is a slight mitral murmur with very nearly lost compensation and this organ is very week indeed.

Kidneys:

Urine, specific gravity 1012, reaction acid, sugar absent while albumen trace.

Lungs:

Normal.

Claimant does not show any marked evidence of senility but does from the long suppuration which has been present in his

Facts within the knowledge of the Board, or any member thereof, relative to the cause of any disability found should be stated.

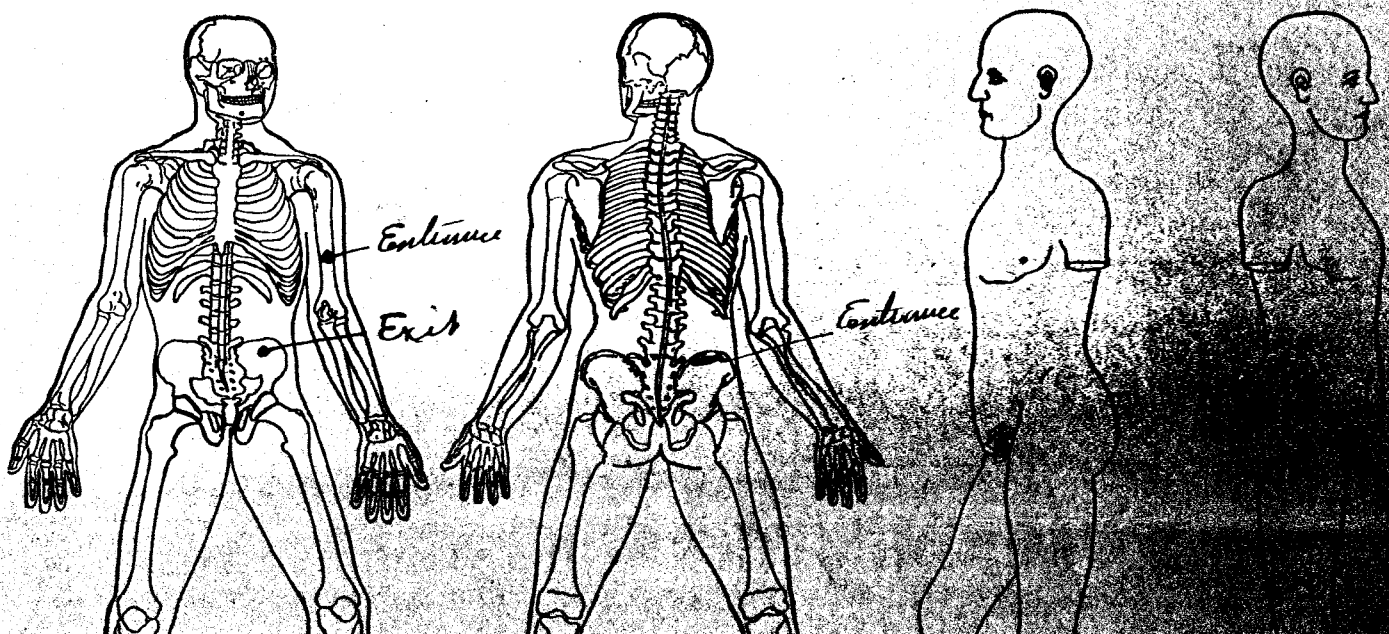
